COPYRIGHT POLICY

Students, staff, faculty and visiting scholars should be aware that most published works are protected by copyright. Thus the right to reproduce published works, including photocopy or create a digital copy, belongs to the author or publisher.

Copying (by reprographic or electronic means) at NSAC is governed by the *Copyright Act* and the *Fair Dealing Policy* of the Association of Universities and Colleges of Canada (AUCC), adopted by NSAC on June 9, 2011. Copying may only be lawfully carried out under the following circumstances:

- the work is in the public domain;
- copying is explicitly allowed by the rights holder through a Creative Commons license or similar statement;
- the work is appropriately licensed by the Library through electronic license agreements;
- the person making the copies has secured the permission of the rights holder;
- the copying falls under one of the educational exceptions of the *Copyright Act*;
- the copying falls under the fair dealing provisions of the *Copyright Act*. (The *Copyright Act* provides that copyright is not infringed or violated by any “fair dealing” for the purposes of private study or research.)

For copying outside of these circumstances, students, staff, faculty and visiting scholars have an obligation to seek the advice of NSAC's University Librarian regarding these limits.
