

# NSAC International Beyond Borders

**Want to spend a semester abroad as an intern contributing to development work and experience living in another country?**

**Internship funding covers airfare, living allowance and other expenses!**

NSAC students (third, fourth year and graduate level) have the opportunity to participate in funded internships in Ethiopia during the 2010-2011 fall semester at the Jimma University College of Agriculture and Veterinary Medicine (JUCAVM).

Internship activities are dependent on the student's skills and partner's needs, but might include:

- Developing tutoring materials and tutoring students (English, math, etc.)
- Assisting faculty in developing teaching materials (hands on lessons, posters, manuals, labs, etc.)
- Collecting research and information on topics relevant to JUCAVM faculty who are writing research papers, journal articles, factsheets, etc.
- Developing training materials, practical exercises, etc. for community training on post harvest techniques/strategies and facilitating sessions where appropriate
- Data entry, assisting in baseline survey report writing
- Designing/organizing/establishing a community garden or other demonstration sites at JUCAVM for local community
- Developing an online resource centre on post-harvest management or other agricultural issues for industry, community members, community groups, farmers, etc.
